Agenda Item 2	Project updates		



- 1. **Oxygen Plant at TUTH**: SWC has approved this project. Dr Pradip Vaidya has taken the lead on behalf of ANMF Nepal in asking for tenders to finalize the builders
- 2. Tilganga Institute of Ophthalmology- Community Eye Centre in Liwang, Rolpa (additional support for USD 20K): ANMF Nepal has asked US to directly get involved with this project as it was difficult Nepal team to get SWC paper work. As it is not clear if the SWC paper work is being processed *Dr Dick Katzaman (action owner)* will get in touch with Khim Gurung (Point of contact from TIO in Nepal). *Action items: a) ask if TIO needs fund assurance letter* (FAL)? b)Ask if TIO has documents that confirms registration to SWC (social welfare council)? c) Ask if a separate MOU is needed from ANMF US and TIO to complete necessary process?
- 3. Manikins procurement and BASIC training for nurses (Nepal Critical Care Development Foundation): already approved by board; Dr Subash Acharya and Shaswat Acharya from ANMF Nepal team are project mangers.
- 4. **Ask Foundation -Telemedicine project**: ANMF Nepal has asked US to directly disburse the funds. The similar questions as in action items in 2 above, has been put forward to ASK foundation. *Dr Santosh Sapkota and Bhupesh Khadka* is co-cordinating with Dr Rashmi Thapa of ASK Foundation.
- 5. **Tarkang Community Health Center**: ANMF US disbursed funds to Pahar Trust Nepal directly which is the non-profit constructing Tarkang CHC. This project has been closed on 4/16/17 by the board.
- 6. Clinical training programs of Dr Jainendra K Choudhary (Minimally-invasive GI surgery in Seattle) and Dr Mahesh Sigdel (fellowship on Glomerulonephritis, NY) has both been completed by the trainees. Funds for this project has to disbursed to ANMF Nepal soon.

  <u>Treasurer, Julia Shepardson</u> is in contact with ANMF Nepal to arrange it.



#### **Project updates Contd:**

7. Following Projects run by ANMF Nepal is on the process of getting approvals from SWC-a)

Public health Project to be conducted in Adchale, Sindhupalchowk; b) Maintenance of
existing Health posts; c) Construction of Additional wards in Chautara Hospital (USD66K).

All of these projects have already been approved by ANMF in the past. USD 50 K has been
allocated to maintain existing Health Posts constructed by ANMF and once the approval process
is completed, funds will be disbursed on case by case basis.

To construct chautara hospital structures, DHO has allocated land. The pre-fab structure has been designed and is submitted to Ministry of health for final approval while waiting for SWC approval as well. Once approved, construction will start soon.

- 8. Aldanda Chauthe community Health center, Nuwakot (approx USD 45K): ANMF Nepal has approved this project after doing their due diligence. This Community Health center (CHC) is run by the local community itself. The staffing at this CHC will ultimately be done by the government but until that happens the community co-operative that has been formed by the locals have set up funds to staff and have deposited NRS 200k at a local bank. After a thorough discussion by the US board members, the project was approved unanimously on 4/16/17. Of the total cost to construct this CHC, USD 35 K will come from the fund collected by Dr Sanjaya Khanal and team, raised specifically for this purpose. This is a project that will be run by ANMF Nepal in conjunction with rest of the other health facilities being constructed and monitored.
- 9. Thapduipipal Heath Post, Nuwakot, originally planned to be constructed has been cancelled as per ANMF Nepal recommendations. Local people and Village Development Committee were unable to provide the requested land to construct the health post.

	-Board decided that all projects should come from one website portal to maintain one door policy of project submission
	-Board decided that ANMF can work with any non-profit organization in Nepal including but not limited to ANMF Nepal. Like wise funds for any approved projects can be disbursed directly to any such non-profit organizations.
	-Board in majority decided that ANMF doesn't need to confine its projects to the ones only approved and sent by ANMF Nepal. It also stressed that ANMF Nepal is still our main partner in Nepal.
	-Board has delegated to the interested board members to form Project committee, choose its leader, determine the number of members and expand the committee at the general meeting to include few members from Nepal and finally formulate the procedural guidelines of project committee.
	-Board also decided that the Project committee should take responsibility to get update website of the ongoing developments of all active projects until it is finally closed.
	-Board agreed that Project committee submit their recommendations to the Board for both approved and disapproved projects so that the final decision on each project is made by the board.
